Ouizzes

- Quizzes will have 3 questions, and may cover memory verses from previous weeks.
- Quiz questions will not ask you merely to recite memory passages; they will ask you to use memory passages to answer a question, to correct a misconception, etc.
- Each quiz will potentially ask questions from all of the previous weeks to the beginning of the quarter.

Final Exam

- The final exam has a variety of questions including true/false, definitions, and openended questions that require a short answer. We will also ask you to use your memory verses to refute false statements.
- You must take the exam in class on Week 10 unless you receive permission from the instructor to take it later. If you receive permission to take your exam late, you must take it at the Study Center within one week after the exam is given in class.
- If you fail the exam, you will be notified by e-mail. You may take a make-up exam at the Study Center within one week of receiving notification of the failed exam.
