What is Missions?

The goal of missions is:

Defining our terms: Evangelism versus Evangelization

Viewing the World: Political countries and people groups Matthew 28:18-20

Nation - Greek word ethnos

<u>People Group</u> – A significantly large sociological grouping of individuals who perceive themselves to have a common affinity for one another because of their shared language, religion, ethnicity, residence, occupation, class or caste, situation or combination of these.

<u>Unreached People Group</u> – (< 2% reached) is a people group among which there is no indigenous community of believing Christians with adequate numbers and resources to evangelize this people group without outside (cross-cultural) assistance. Unreached people groups lack a church that has the numbers and strength to reach their own people.

How is the Evangelization of the World Accomplished?

Plant multiplying churches in every people group of the world

Where are the unreached people groups?

10/40 window

85-90% of the world's unreached peoples live in this area.

This is where 3 large religious blocs of unreached peoples are mainly found: Islam, Hinduism and Buddhism.

80% of the world's poor are here

Global Poverty Statistics and Generosity

- 1.2 billion people live on less than 1 dollar per day
- 2.5 billion live on less than 2 dollars per day (about 40% of the world)

The Challenge of Crossing Cultures

<u>Cultural Imperialism</u>

Our answer to the myth that missionaries destroy culture

Missionaries have done far greater good.

Some aspects of culture need to be changed.

Cultures are in a constant state of change

Ethnocentrism

Identification

Contextualization

The missionary presents the gospel in ways which consider the world view of the local culture. This includes adapting the Biblical message into <u>forms</u> that are <u>true to the Scriptures</u> but appropriate to the local culture.
